We cannot guarantee special needs will be met if you do not include that information on the online registration form.

If you are not the group contact person, please do familiarize yourself with the registration package that will be distributed to participants.

### **Key information:**

- Retreat Dates: Monday, July 3, to Friday, July 7
- Location: Camp Jubilee, North Vancouver
- Cost: \$450 per person (all participants and adult leaders must pay this fee)
- All permission forms are due to the Ministries and Outreach Office by June 23, 4:30pm

You are strongly encouraged to meet with the participants from your parish in advance of, and following, *Arise* 2023. Please help organize the meetings and communicate all information to the youth and their parents. The purpose of these meetings is to go over the logistics of getting to the dock and ensuring that you know the youth before you get to Camp Jubilee. **The Head Adult Leader must know all the participants** in their group **PRIOR** to getting to the dock on July 3, especially those with special needs and/or considerations. We recommend meeting with and talking to the parents of all your participants.

Again, we thank you for your support of and work in youth ministry. We look forward to meeting and working with you in July. May God bless you as we all prepare for the *Arise 2023* retreat and especially touch the hearts of the youth who will be attending.

One of the biggest mistakes we make in offering retreats to young people is not making any connection between the retreat experience of community and their parish community. There is often a "disconnect" between the spiritual and emotional highs experienced during a retreat and the realities of everyday life.

\*\* It is very important that parish leaders and adult leaders work to prepare their youth for the program and <u>follow-up</u> with them when they return to their homes, schools, and parishes.

Included below is a Job Description that outlines your duties and responsibilities as an Adult Leader. Also, we have included two suggested meeting plans that can be used to gather youth before *Arise* and to reflect with them after the week. These meetings should be used to help develop relationships not only among the youth, but also with adults in their parish who can share the vision of a community on fire with love for God and for one another.

While at the retreat, the program coordinator, support staff and team leads will conduct daily meetings with the adult leaders accompanying the youth to check in and give further instructions and pray together.

### Arise 2023 Adult Leader Job Description

Your presence in the Arise 2023 Program is very important.

You have a great impact on the participants!



### **Duties/Responsibilities BEFORE the retreat:**

- Get to know the participants
- Plan a gathering with the participants so they have an opportunity to get to know you and to meet the other participants with your group
- Review the forms to be aware of any special needs/considerations with any of the participants in your group

### **Duties/Responsibilities DURING the retreat:**

- Show respect and care
- Actively participate in the program with the youth in your group
- Be a companion who can help to focus the group, encourage enthusiasm for each challenge, and keep the peace
- Spend time with the youth and try to avoid spending more time with the other Adult Leaders
- Most important: Be an example to the youth
- Be on time for programming
- Lead some small group discussions in particular, the evening group meetings
- You and any other adults will be responsible for the youth in your particular cabin This means supervising all youth in your cabin at night, cabin clean up, and cabin chores
- Faithfully attend all Adult Leader meetings during the week
- Organize and guide youth in doing chores thoroughly and responsibly
- Allow youth to quietly spend time journaling on the pages of each day's section; have a small group sharing on their thoughts and feelings of the day
- Establish a bed-time routine; see that all observe Lights Out; guard rest-time
- Have fun!

# HEAT TREATMENT ROOM PROCESS

At Camp Jubilee we are aware of bed bugs in the Lower Mainland and have proactively taken steps to avoid problems.

A bed bug heat chamber is onsite to treat all belongings of the guests and staff.

This process takes about 2 hours or more upon arrival.

The room gets as hot as the high setting on a dryer.

Guests who require medicine to treat their allergic reactions must bring their own medicine including EPIPEN and/or Benadryl (or similar product). Guests should consult with a doctor to establish the type and amount of medicine required for the duration of trip.

I REPRESENT AND WARRANT to the Releasees that (a) the Guest is in good health (including physical, emotional, and behavioural condition) and that is not potentially dangerous or harmful for the Guest to participate in the Activities; and (b) if the Guest is a minor or disabled, I have the authority to sign this agreement on behalf of the Guest.

I INDEMNIFY the Releasees with respect to any Claims: (a) from any third parties arising out of the Guest's participation in the Activities; and (b) if the Guest is a minor or disabled, arising out of the Guest's participation in the Activities which may be brought by or on behalf of the Guest or when the Guest reaches the age of majority.

I understand and agree that the Activities present a wide variety of inherent risks, hazards, and conditions, to the Guest, not all of which are easily foreseeable, and which could result in any type of physical or emotional injury. Such conditions include uneven terrain, fast changing weather, animal and plant life, participation in the Activities by any third parties, and use of assorted vehicles and equipment. Camp Jubilee's agreement to permit the Guest to partake in Activities is based on the strict understanding that I assume all risks involved in partaking in the Activities (and the trip in general) including the risks to the Guest as set out in this agreement and the risks to others as a result of the Guest's participation in the Activities and that the Releasees will not be held responsible in any way should the Guest or others become injured or suffer any adverse consequences, even if such adverse consequence arises from faulty or improperly maintained equipment, incomplete or inadequate instructions, inaccurate assessments as to the Guest's level of ability, or the negligence or actions of the Releasees or others. I understand that negligence includes failure on the part of any of the Releasees to take reasonable steps to safeguard or protect the Guest from the risks, dangers, and hazards of the Activities. I understand that Camp Jubilee's facilities, and any foods provided, are not allergen-free, gluten-free, or scent-free. I understand that the Guest will be expected to uphold the standards of behavior expected of the school/organization.
